



PARTICIPATE IN A RECYCLING PROGRAM^{1,2}

 Specialist recycling companies, such as TerraCycle, offer schemes to recycle contact lens waste at no cost to lens wearers.

DROP OFF YOUR WASTE^{1, 2}

 Collect your waste and drop it off in a specialist recycling bin found in participating stores of retailers like Specsavers or Boots.





DAILY DISPOSABLE LENSES ^{1,2}

- **Best option:** Drop off collected lenses at a specialist recycling bin.
- If not accessible: throw them in the waste bin.
- **IMPORTANT:** Never flush your lenses down the toilet or sink!

BLISTER TRAYS^{1, 2}

- Ensure they are dry before dropping off.
- **Best option:** Drop off collected blister trays at a specialist recycling bin.
- If not accessible: throw them in the waste bin.


EXTERNAL PACKAGING^{1, 2}

 Cardboard packaging can be recycled by municipal household waste management.



FOIL LIDS^{1, 2}

- **Best option:** Drop off collected foil lids at a specialist recycling bin.
- If not accessible: throw them in the waste bin.
